**This is the current federal per diem rate. Because our conference is scheduled in October, it is possible the federal per diem rate will change when their fiscal year begins on October 1, 2016. If the rate does change, we will be charged the new rate.

Complimentary shuttle to and from the airport for overnight guests. Once you arrive in Madison, please call our front desk (608-285-8000) for pick-up. Once you arrive at the hotel and check-in, you can schedule your shuttle back to the airport with the bell station.

Parking is \$10 per day for hotel guests. For visitors, the cost is \$2 per hour, maximum of \$10.

You can expect temperatures to be in the high 50's to low 60s with overnight lows in the lower 40s to upper 30s. We will be taking a bus to dinner on Wednesday evening, therefore, we ask that everyone be at the reported pick-up area on time.

Madison is a mid-sized city in south-central Wisconsin. One of only two cities in North America situated on an isthmus (the other is [Seattle](#)), Madison is defined by its five lakes: Mendota, Monona, Wingra, Waubesa, and Kegonsa. Through a combination of factors, including the state capital and the University of Wisconsin—Madison, the city has more to offer than might be expected from a metropolitan area of about 500,000.
